Panduit to release new label printers at Kalgoorlie's GME

Panduit will unveil two new thermal transfer printers for label production on **Stand 1115** during the Goldfields Mining Expo (GME) at the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Racing Club from October 28-30, 2008.

The compact and rugged Panther LS8 hand-held printer is described as an ideal tool for printing labels from laptop or desktop computers at remote job sites while the TDP43MY desktop printer is designed to produce high volume component labels, safety and facility markers, self-laminating, heat shrink and vinyl cloth wire/cable markers and printable marker plates.

Panduit's Opticam fibre optic connectors will also make their debut at GME. The connectors feature a dual cam design which secures both the fibre and buffer in one action with a translucent inner housing assembly allowing visual inspection and verification of the fibre termination.

Panduit's GME stand will also include:

- Lockout devices that secure energy-isolating devices, such as circuit breakers and disconnect switches, in a safe position
- Tagout devices that identify an energy-isolating device as a source of potential danger without the physical restraint of a lockout device
- Stainless steel cable ties which provide a strong, durable and fast method of bundling hoses and cables, including high voltage cables
- Stainless steel strapping, for applications from bundling cables and hoses to strapping pipes or poles, that can be installed up to three times faster than conventional strapping systems
- Custom-embossed and laser-etched stainless steel marker tags for heavy industrial, marine and chemical environments.
